Find Articles in Library Databases: Education Full Text by Wilson

On University Library's Web Page under 'E' in Find Articles → Article Databases A-Z.

- Because the library's online catalog, IUCAT, does not contain articles, you will need to use a library database to find the citations of scholarly articles.
- In education, one of the primary databases is Education Full Text, produced by The H.W. Wilson Company.
- **Education Full Text** is a database that lists **articles** of at least one column in length from English-language periodicals and yearbooks published in the United States and elsewhere. It also includes English-language **books** relating to education published in 1995 or later. Abstracts are included for articles published since January 1994. Abstracts range from 50 to 300 words and describe the content and scope of the source documents. Full-text coverage begins in January 1996.
- **NOT ALL CITATIONS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN FULL-TEXT. Please use Find It/SFX to link to IUCAT to search by journal title to locate print copies of articles not found in full-text.**

Search Tips

- Enter a word or phrase in the first text-entry area and make the appropriate selection from the 'as:' drop-down list.
- When using the **All - Smart Search** query do not use truncation symbols or other special characters. The Wilson **All - Smart Search** query will automatically search those options. Simply type the word or phrase that you are interested in and click **Start**.
- To formulate a search within specific fields, select **and**, **or**, or **not**, and enter additional terms in the second entry area. You can also use a third entry area for a more complex search. If desired, modify your search by selecting from the available on-screen options for sorting, limiting, article types, and physical descriptions

If there is no Full Text for the article, click the Find It button to see if the library has another database with this article.

What's this button that says Find It? **Find It**

Find It is a linking feature available in many article databases. It provides you with a menu of options available for your citation, including the online catalog, full-text journals, other databases, and interlibrary loan, etc.

If there is no full text available in the database you are searching, click the icon to open a new window, hopefully there will be links to full text resources, but if not, you can search the online catalog to see if University Library owns what you need, or if not request through interlibrary loan. These are not the only services available, just the most frequently used.

Find Articles in Library Databases: ERIC (Educational Resources Information Center)

On University Library's Web Page under 'E' in Find Articles → Article Databases A-Z.

Established in 1966, ERIC is supported by the U.S. Department of Education's Institute of Education Sciences. At the heart of ERIC is the largest education database in the world -- containing more than 1 million records of journal articles, research reports, curriculum and teaching guides, conference papers, and books.

Two types of publications indexed in the ERIC database

ERIC Documents:

- ERIC Documents are items that are NOT journal articles. They can be books, research reports, speeches and conference papers, studies, theses, instructional materials (for students), lesson plans, manuals and handbooks, bibliographies, or tests. Identified by ED followed by a six-digit number, e.g. ED459424.

ERIC Journals.

- 'ERIC Journals' are simply journal articles. These are indicated by the letters EJ followed by a six-digit number, e.g. EJ358752.

Where can I get ERIC?


1. Select the letter 'E' on the Find Articles>>Article Databases A-Z link on the library's home page. Scroll down the list to see the different options for searching ERIC. ERIC is available from two different database companies: EBSCOhost and CSA (Cambridge Scientific Abstracts), and also for free from the Dept. of Education. The University Library has paid for the subscriptions to ERIC from CSA and EBSCOhost. To access remotely from off campus, you will need your netID and password.
 - a. **The First Option: ERIC from CSA**
Allows you to search other CSA databases simultaneously (like PsycInfo), has FIND IT capability, and links to full text ERIC Documents
 - b. **The Second Option: ERIC from EBSCOhost**
Allows you to search other EBSCO databases, links to full-text ERIC Documents, and is also FIND IT capable. Use the EBSCOhost interface for maximum searching capabilities. Accessing this version from your school or public library's version of Inspire will not give you access to full-text resources or linking.
 - c. **ERIC from the Department of Ed**
<http://www.eric.ed.gov/>
This site allows you to retrieve ERIC Documents in PDF format directly with ED number. The Adobe Acrobat program is required to view the EDs.
You can also search this version of ERIC to locate journal articles, but there are no links to full-text journal articles and the searching options may be less sophisticated than what is available through EBSCO or CSA:

General ERIC Tips

- ERIC Documents are identified by the letters ED followed by a six-digit number, e.g. ED439171.
- Many recent ERIC Documents are available in full-text PDF format online. Generally speaking, items published from 1993 onward or that have a number of ED348467 or higher are available in full-text online.
- Older ERIC Documents are available in Microfiche in the Reference Room.
- The ERIC database does not have the full-text of the articles. To locate the complete article, you can use the Find It/SFX linking tools in the databases to locate electronic full-text.
- If full-text is not available, you may also need to search IUCAT to locate the print journal in our library. **Do not** search by EJ Number, Title or Author of the article, **instead search in IUCAT for the journal title, or use the FIND IT/SFX link to do this automatically.**

- Enter a search term in the box. If you would like to do a phrase search, put the words in quotations.
- The truncation symbol is an asterisk: *
e.g.: program* = program, programs, programming
- **Advanced Search** allows you to combine terms for more precise results using AND, OR, and NOT
- Once you have completed more than one search, Clicking on **Search History** allows you to combine your searches using **or** or **and** or save your search to repeat at a later time.
- **Alerts** allow you to have a saved search run automatically and to have the results e-mailed. This can be helpful if you have a long-term research project and want to be notified when new articles are published.

You can also search multiple databases simultaneously in CSA, including *Education: A SAGE Full-Text Collection*. [Please note that some features unique to ERIC will not be available if you search two databases simultaneously.]

Education: a SAGE Full-Text Collection consists of 19 journals published by SAGE and participating societies, some journals going back 22 years. The full-text of all years is included and encompasses over 5,000 articles.

In this screen, you can click in the boxes next to the descriptors (Subject Terms) to conduct a search combining multiple descriptors using AND (to make your search more narrow and produce fewer results) and OR (to make your search results more broad and produce more results).

Clicking the **Mark This Record** box saves the citation so you can print or email this or any other checked items at a later time.

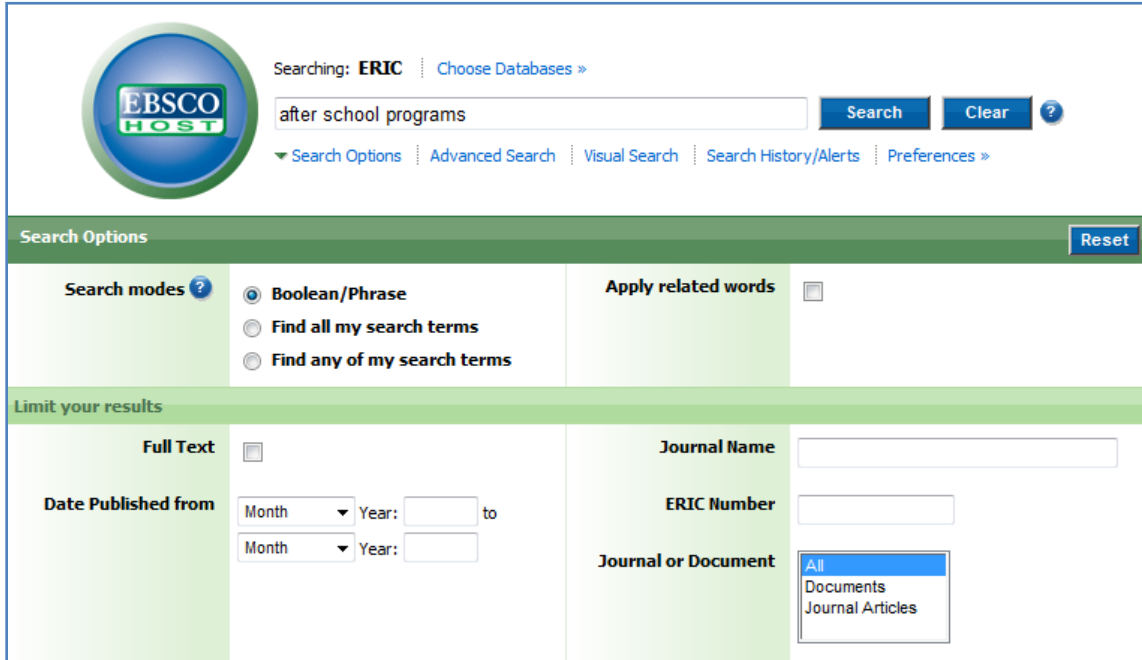

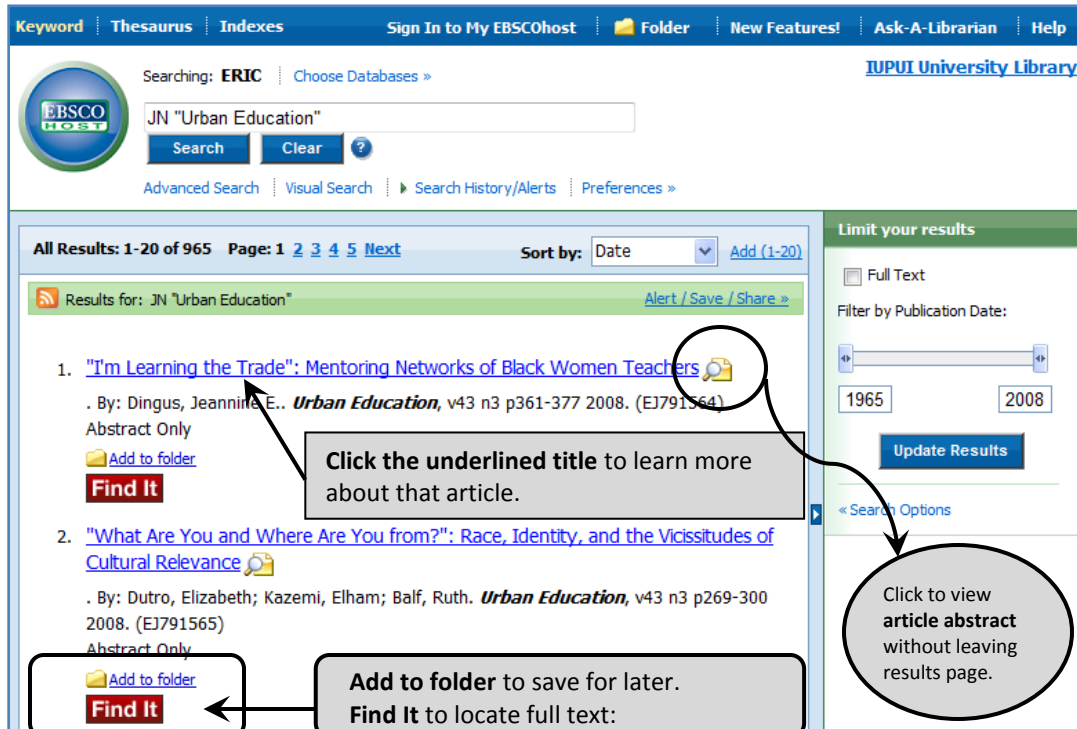
The EBSCO database *Education Research Complete* is available for a limited time as a trial database. It can also be searched with the other EBSCO databases.

- Professional Development Collection: "Designed for professional educators, this database provides a highly specialized collection of over 500 full text journals, including more than 300 peer-reviewed titles. Professional Development Collection is the most comprehensive collection of full text education journals in the world."
- ERIC content is the same regardless of searching from CSA or EBSCO. **Note:** you cannot search the ERIC Thesaurus if also searching Professional Development Collection.

IUCAT Basics

- (1) IUCAT is the statewide catalog for all IU campus libraries. It will tell you if we have a specific book, journal, video, CD, DVD, etc. The IUPUI University Library is identified in the catalog as 'I-UNIVLIB' All IUPUI Libraries begin with the 'I' prefix. E.g. I-Law, I-Dentistry, I-Medicine, I-Art
- (2) You can request that **books** from other IU libraries be sent to IUPUI. (This only applies to BOOKS. If you need an article that we don't have, you must use Interlibrary Loan to request a copy). Having books sent to IUPUI from other IU campus libraries is a service called *Request Delivery*, but you must **LOG IN** before you search using your campus network ID and password.
