M I S S I O N

Inform the IUPUI campus and wider community of learners through our educational resources, technologies, and expertise.

Connect people with our resources, our services, and each other.

Transform the lives of our community members by facilitating discovery, creativity, teaching, learning, and research. The University Library actively partners in the transformation to new and more accessible formats.

A progressive leader among academic libraries, the IUPUI University Library offers the campus and community technologically advanced services such as rich media technology, 3D printing, PC/MAC specialized software, librarian chat, live tech assistance, as well as specialized instructional space. The library focuses on leveraging technology to support student success with 28 full-time faculty librarians, plus programs in information literacy and digital scholarship. With millions of library database downloads each year, the library's resources are always available to students. The library is the primary informal learning space on campus, and continues to update technology, offer public and private individual and communal learning spaces, and create innovative goods and services for our patrons.

- University Library serves thousands of undergraduates, graduate, and professional students. In 2019-20, library staff answered over 7,000 reference questions, in-person and online.
- Last fiscal year, librarians provided 349 instructional sessions and 887 research consultations.
- IUPUI ranked #11 in the United States for Free Open Access by the Centre for Science and Technology Studies at Leiden University.
- In the last six years, [IUPUI ScholarWorks](#) has multiplied by more than eight times – from 2,609 items at the beginning of 2013 to 21,632 items today.
- The University Library currently supports 24 [open access journals](#), from fields of science, religion, teaching, law, and more. OA journals have had 413,062 views this year.
- The National Service Archives was launched in 2019 to collect the records of individuals and organizations involved in AmeriCorps, Peace Corps, and the promotion of national service and volunteerism. More than 448 cubic feet of new materials related to national service have been added to the collection since its introduction.
- The library's Student Employee Program (STEP) continues to engage our 52 undergraduate and graduate student employees who fulfill a range of important functions including: providing reference and circulation services at the Service & Information Desk; managing submissions to our institutional repository; providing research support for librarians; serving as peer tutors in information literacy instruction; digital scanning; building-wide technology support; and mailroom and interlibrary loan duties. - Our second year of the Seed Library was adapted as a mail service due to COVID precautions and we ended up mailing over 1,000 seed packets to IUPUI students, staff, faculty, and community members in 56 cities in Indiana.
- University Library supplied 19,005 items to patrons through IU Request Delivery, Interlibrary Loan, and Article Delivery Services, filling 95% of requests.

During the last four months of our fiscal year, the library made significant changes to how we connect with users. With the building closed, faculty and staff working from home, and students unable to use our study spaces, we emphasized the use of electronic resources, shifted to virtual tech support and virtual reference services, and implemented weekly forums via zoom for our employees to stay abreast of changing guidelines, and campus situations.

COLLECTIONS AND INFORMATION ACCESS



The IUPUI University Library serves over 20,000 undergraduate students and over 8,000 graduate and professional students. We serve a full- and part-time campus teaching staff of over 6,000 faculty, librarians, specialists, resident appointees, and research fellows. All can access over 80,000 electronic serial titles and thousands of eBooks and databases online at any time.

The University Library and Herron Art Library together hold almost 2 million titles and provide access to 1 million unique e-books, 145,000 e-journals, and over 500 e-databases and online collections.

Digital Collections

IUPUI's institutional digital repository, IUPUI ScholarWorks, shares over 20,000 articles, posters, reports, theses, educational materials and historical documents submitted by members of the campus community in order to address research communities' need for new outlets in scholarly communication.

Cumulatively, *ScholarWorks*, has had 13,834,866 downloads and page views. ScholarWorks averages 150,000 downloads a month. A total of 3,325 items were uploaded into *ScholarWorks* in 2019-2020. Of these, 2,945 were journal articles made openly accessible as a result of the Open Access Policy. During the calendar year, we made over 70% of articles by our authors openly accessible so that anyone with internet access can read them. The Herron Library currently hosts 11,822 items to the library’s digital collections. The 16 Herron digital collections had 65,246 page views this fiscal year.

Archives & Special Collections Digital Repositories:

- Ruth Lilly Special Collections and Archives’ eArchives had 351,423 views/downloads of 9,552 items in 2019-2020 Foundation Literature Online/FOLIO had 201,797 views/downloads in 2019-2020 of 1268 items.
- eArchives had 351,423 views/downloads of 9,552 items in 2019-2020.
- Philanthropy Resources Online/PRO has been viewed 3,589 times, providing access to 106,404 items, and 542 multi-page items.



VISITORS

The University Library serves thousands of patrons from the general public. Indiana residents over the age of 18 are eligible to apply for a borrower’s card, and teachers with a valid school ID or business card may borrow an extra audio-visual item for teaching purposes under the guest borrower program. Our guest users can check out materials; use computers, software, and wireless internet; access our research databases; and utilize our printing/photocopying services, as well as reference assistance.

CIRCULATION

The University Library circulates thousands of books and other materials each year, and IUPUI users are able to renew items online. Undergraduate students may borrow up to 50 items for 45 days. University staff and graduate students can borrow 125 items for 120 days; and faculty can borrow up to 500 items for 120 days. All users must return audio-visual material within 14 days. Other items, such as calculators, phone chargers, wireless presentation remotes, dry erase boards and markers, board games are also available for short time frame loans.

Interlibrary Loan

Materials requested through Interlibrary Loan (ILL) come from a network of local, national, and international libraries. Despite not having access to our physical collection or being able to borrow books for over three and a half months, over the past academic year the University Library accessed over 19,000 books, films, and articles for users via this shared network and supplied another 13,000+. Most articles are delivered within 8 to 48 hours. Sharing materials with other institutions allows the University Library to leverage its resources by delivering information on demand.



In response to the international pandemic and libraries closing their buildings as a result, the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) partnered with Open Access Button to launch "Resource Sharing during COVID-19" (RSCVD), built on the InstantILL tool that IUPUI University Library helped develop. This pilot project was run as a way to help libraries worldwide fill their patrons' requests despite the pandemic's effects on their usual networks. Between April 21 and July 5, 2020, RSCVD volunteers filled over 2,800 article and book chapter requests, a direct result of work that University Library did in 2019.

[Teaching librarians](#) at University Library collaborate with instructors to teach first-year through graduate students in every major, department, and school. Librarians are experts at Information Literacy, the set of competencies needed to find, use, evaluate, and create information ethically and effectively. Librarians provide synchronous and asynchronous instruction, in addition to developing research guides, learning objects, and tutorials.

INFORMATION SERVICES

Librarians, staff, and student employees at the Services & Information Desk answer thousands of reference questions. Additionally, [subject librarians](#) conduct in-depth one-on-one research consultations for students and faculty via telephone, chat, e-mail, in-person, and via zoom on all aspects of the research process such as choosing a topic, determining information needs, finding resources, and evaluating and citing those sources.

LIBRARY SPACE AND TECHNOLOGY

With over 350 computer workstations, the library informs, connects, and transforms the lives of students through leading-edge technology. In the 2120 Learning Lab, students learn to navigate electronic resources, and the fourth floor Rich Media area gives them the tools to produce high-end multimedia projects in a collaborative environment. Five of our group study rooms are specialty multi-media production rooms outfitted with powerful computers and video editing equipment. All public PC stations are outfitted with *Jaws 17*, screen-reading software for blind and low vision students, and 76 stations are outfitted with *Kurzweil 300*, text-to-speech software for English language learners, students with learning challenges, and low vision students.

The library has a 3D Printing Studio where students, faculty, and staff can work with a library 3D modeling expert in using MakerBot Replicators, MakerBot Digitizers, LulzBot 3D printers, Makerbot 3D scanners to design and create 3D teaching aids, research projects, and coursework. The studio had 88 individual 3D print projects from July 2019-March 2020. The studio was involved in campus-wide projects such as the Regatta and the IUPUI's 50th Anniversary; and community projects for the Madame Walker Centre, Indiana School for the Blind, and the Indianapolis Colts.

The library also boasts a Virtual and Augmented Reality Lab, which had 550 visits from students, faculty, and community partners from July 2019-March 2020. This year, the School of Engineering and Technology, School of Science, and School of Liberal Arts had the highest levels of engagement with the VR Lab.

In 19-20, study rooms at the library had 26,201 bookings. From March-August, study rooms were closed and not available for reservations.
